BOND BILL FUNDING SECURED FOR DISTRICT 41

Our district received significant funding for projects that will strengthen and uplift our communities:

- WBC Forest Park Renaissance \$800,000
- Children's Guild \$250,000
- Ivy and Pearls for Excellence \$270,000
- Ruderman Library & Playground \$120,000
- Chesapeake Bay Outward Bound School \$75,000
- Free Housing Project \$50,000
- Gatehouse Renovation Project \$25,000



In just my first few weeks in office, I co-sponsored 20 legislative bills each one rooted in justice, accountability, and opportunity for Marylanders.

These bills reflect the priorities of our district: safety, equity, and systems that work for the people.

Here are a few key pieces of legislation I'm especially proud to support:







HB0853 - The Maryland Second Look Act

 Gives incarcerated individuals a chance to request a sentence reduction after 20 years, if certain conditions are met.

HB0675 – Public Safety: Rape Kit Testing

• Strengthens the Rape Kit Testing Grant Fund to ensure better tracking and timely processing.

HB0860 – Public Nuisance: Common Carriers

 Prevents utility and trucking companies from damaging public infrastructure and causing community disruptions.

FIRST SESSION HIGH LIGHTS

Looking ahead, I remain committed to:

- Advancing health equity and improving healthcare access
- Addressing housing justice and supporting affordability
- Strengthening education for our youth
- Championing criminal justice reform

I'm proud to support legislation from the Legislative Black Caucus's 2025 Agenda, including the Youth Equity and Safety (YES) Act and the formation of a commission to study reparations for African Americans in Maryland.
